A More Powerful WIVH To Air Soon

When this newsletter was sent to press, work was continuing on the problems that have faced WIVH the past two months. At this writing, WIVH's antenna has been placed on the tower at Blue Mountain and arrangements are being made to direct the signal there from the studios. A rather unique development has arisen because the tower site is not in sight of the studio. In order to transfer the signal to the tower, an STL, (Studio/Transmitter Link) may be used or an internet supplier could also do the job. Before using an STL a site must be found in view of the studio, but also in view of Blue Mountain. Permission from such a property owner would be needed for WIVH to place a small equipment box there.

Amazingly, all the problems, originally undetected, have been resolved and it is only a matter of a short time before WIVH is back on air running greater power and reaching into areas not previously receiving the signal. Burl Updyke, WIVH Manager, thanks everyone for their prayers, encouragement and support through this time. "Considering the time it takes to get this information to you, the situation may be resolved before you receive this newsletter," he said.

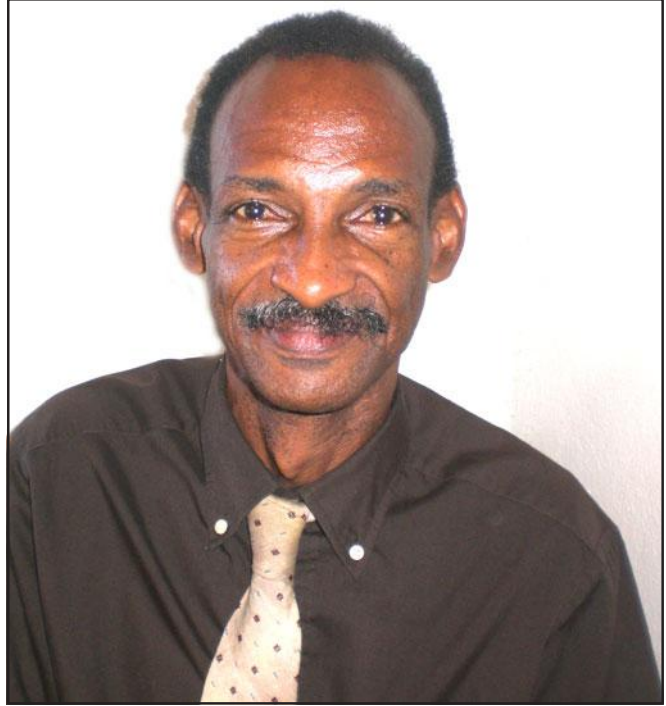
