John Sorensen of *Share Life Today*, heard weekday mornings at 8:20 am on WIVH, offers great tips on how to effectively share the gospel with those around us.


New Book Series from Adventures in Odyssey

Are your kids always glued to their screens? According to Common Sense Media, tweens spend more than four hours a day on screens, and teens are on their screens for nearly seven hours a day. It may be because they like having virtual adventures, overcoming obstacles and using their imagination via the internet.



Helping Kids Deal with Hurricanes



Hurricane season is coming to an end, but a book came to the attention of WIVH General Manager Tim Madeira that may be of interest to our listeners. It was inspired by the hurricanes we experienced last year. Children's author and counselor Alyssa Cathers thought it was important to not only meet the physical needs of those affected by the hurricane, but also the spiritual needs.

To meet that need, she wrote a book called *Abby and Frankie's Help for the Hard Stuff*. Based on the characters from her previous book, *Anxious Abby and the Camp Trust Challenge*, this workbook addresses hurricanes and other natural disasters from a biblical perspective. Her workbooks have been distributed to children who were affected by recent hurricanes by both Convoy of Hope and chaplains with the Billy Graham Rapid Response Team.
